Finding Persistent Links to EBSCO Database Articles

Often your instructor will ask for persistent links to articles you use for assignments.

Those are easy to find in the EBSCO databases. Just follow these instructions:

- Within the results list that you generated with your search, click on the title of the article of interest, which is a link to the article's full citation.
