### Saint Joseph's College of Maine

Alford Hall, the academic hub of the campus, offers spectacular views of Sebago Lake and beyond to Mount Washington. It has the latest wireless technology and air-conditioned classrooms.

### Location

Saint Joseph's campus sits on the shore of Sebago Lake, Maine's second-largest lake and a four-season recreational area. It is just 20 miles northwest of coastal Portland, the state's largest city. The college is an hour north of Portsmouth and two hours from Boston.

## Campus Life

Saint Joseph's College is located on 350 acres overlooking Sebago Lake, one of Maine's most beautiful spots. The campus itself is easily navigated on foot: scenic paths connect campus buildings, and a brisk five-minute walk will take you anywhere you need to be. A hilly descent to our own private sandy beach opens on a panoramic view of the lake with the White Mountains as a backdrop on the horizon.



On campus, such social activities as a nightly Bistro with a cash bar in the Student Lounge in the Alford Center will be offered. A real Down East "Lobstah Bake," complete with steamed clams, corn-on-the-cob and strawberry short-cake, takes place Thursday evening and is included in the tuition fee. Evening bus excursions to Portland and Freeport (home of LL Bean) may be offered if there is sufficient interest.



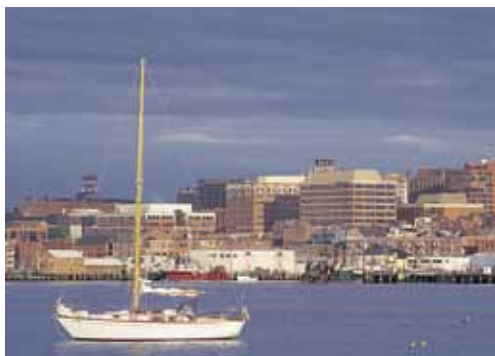
The Alford Recreation Center offers a wide variety of sport and exercise options: indoor track, Nautilus weight machines, free weights, cardiovascular machines, swimming pool, and basketball courts. The center also houses lounges and public areas suitable for studying and socializing. The college has a small beach on Sebago Lake and walking trails. So prepare to enjoy the Maine summer during the Advanced Placement Summer Institute.



### Accommodations

**On-campus** housing is provided in our student residence halls. Rooms are single occupancy, in either a five-bedroom suite with semi-private baths or a traditional modern hall with one large, single-sex, shared bathroom per floor. Rooms are basic and include single beds, desks, bureaus, wardrobes and overhead lighting. Landlines for all incoming and local outgoing calls (phone not provided) and a wireless high speed Internet connection are available. The college provides one set of linens (towels, washcloths, sheets & pillow case). You may want to pack extra towels, a small desk lamp and other amenities. The housing fee includes breakfast and dinner each day at Bon Appétit Café. A non-participating adult may share your room. He or she is responsible for his or her own meals, which can be purchased at Bon Appétit Café.

**Off-campus** accommodations near Saint Joseph's are limited, due to its location in the heart of one of Maine's most enjoyable recreation areas at the height of the busy summer season. If you prefer to stay on your own, early planning is essential, and the following resources may be helpful:

## Arrival at/ Departure from Saint Joseph's College

Free van service between the Portland air, bus and train terminals and the campus (about a 30 minute ride) is available to all participants residing on campus. A van service request form will be included with your registration confirmation. If you are staying off campus, you are responsible for your own transportation.

## Course Tuition

Tuition and fees for each course: \$925.

Tuition and fees with Room & Board included: \$1225.

Chemistry lab fee is \$50.

The tuition includes course materials as well as lunch and a Maine lobster bake at the college's Bon Appétit Café. Tuition with Room & Board also includes breakfast and dinner.

## Dining Services

Saint Joseph's food service, Bon Appétit, is committed to fresh, high quality ingredients and creative cooking. We think you will find their offerings healthful, delicious, and unlike typical college fare. Meal service is cafeteria style and includes soups, hot entrees, deli selections, a salad bar that includes prepared cold salads, and a dessert and fruit bar. Participants choosing to stay off campus are responsible for arranging their own breakfast and dinner each day or may purchase meals at Bon Appétit.

## Cancellation Policy

A **nonrefundable \$100 deposit** is required at the time of registration to reserve your place. The balance is due July 9, 2010. A P.O. from your school is considered full payment. Any cancellations received after July 9 will receive a 50% refund on the balance.

### BIOLOGY

Michael Schaab, Department of Arts & Sciences at Maine Maritime Academy, Castine, Maine, has taught high school science for 28 years, and at the college level for the last seven years. He is a College Board consultant and exam reader, as well as a mentor for the State of Maine. He has developed and delivered numerous AP Chemistry and AP Biology workshops and summer institutes for the last eight years. His primary focus of educational interest and research is in the area of laboratory learning.

### CALCULUS AB

Gerald Pockl, of John Marshall High School, West Virginia, has been teaching AP Calculus since 1984, and has been an AP reader since 1996 and a table leader since 2001. He is the author of the six “free response” questions for Houghton-Mifflin’s AP Online Test Preparation (Dec. 2004).

### CALCULUS BC

John Jensen is the faculty chair in mathematics at Rio Salado College in Tempe, Arizona. Prior to this, he taught high school mathematics for 30 years in Phoenix, including Advanced Placement Calculus. John has been an AP Calculus reader and table leader for 18 years, and has conducted more than 200 workshops and institutes in the U.S., Canada, Europe, South America and Asia. He is a former fellow of the Woodrow Wilson Mathematics Institute at Princeton University, and he holds a National Board Adolescence & Young Adulthood Certificate in Mathematics.

### CHEMISTRY

Cheri Smith is the science department head at Yale Secondary, a medium-sized secondary school near Vancouver, British Columbia. Cheri has been teaching AP Chemistry since 1988, and she has worked as a consultant in the areas of AP Chemistry and Pre-AP Science for over a decade. Most recently, Cheri has assisted in editing and writing of the Special Focus materials for the College Board’s AP Chemistry workshops and the reviewing of materials for AP Central. She has been an AP Chemistry exam reader, table leader and question leader since 1998.



## ECONOMICS

Dick Brunelle is the Executive Director of the Economic Education Foundation, a non-profit organization dedicated to promoting high school economic programs by providing professional development and support to high school teachers. He also teaches economic courses at Fitchburg State College in Massachusetts. Dick taught AP Economics at Ashland High School, where he also was the chair of the Social Studies Department before retiring from that position. Dick has been conducting economic institutes throughout the U.S. and Canada for more than ten years, and he has served for 5 years on the Test Development Committee for AP Economics.



## ENGLISH LANGUAGE & COMPOSITION

John Brassil, of Mt. Ararat High School, Maine, has taught AP English Language & Composition for more than 20 years. A table leader at the AP English Language and Composition reading, he has conducted AP summer institute sessions and professional development workshops throughout New England and in Canada. He also mentors new AP English Language teachers in Maine.

## ENGLISH LITERATURE & COMPOSITION

Thom Wade has been teaching AP Literature at Arroyo Grande H.S., Calif., for the past fifteen years. He has been an AP reader and table leader for the past eight years. He received his National Board Certification in 2002 and has presented at numerous state and national conferences, including a session at the 2003 National Advanced Placement Conference.



## ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE

Jeanne Kaidy teaches biology and AP Environmental Science at McQuaid Jesuit High School in Rochester, N.Y., where she serves as chair of the science department. Jeanne also is an adjunct instructor of environmental science at Monroe Community College. She has participated as a reader for the College Board for the past five years and is an AP consultant. Jeanne is co-author of the test bank and instructor's manual that accompanies the most recent edition of the AP textbook, *Living in the Environment*, by G. Tyler Miller, and is a contributing author to the AP lab manual for environmental science, an inquiry-based lab manual that accompanies the text.

## EUROPEAN HISTORY

Dr. Lenore Schneider has taught AP European History for 15 years at New Canaan High School, Conn., where she also teaches AP World History. She has served as table leader for ten years at the scoring of the national AP test, been a member of the AP European History Test Development Committee, and taught numerous workshops and institutes in the past years.

## FRENCH LANGUAGE

Mona Mulhair teaches AP French Language and Literature at Las Lomas H.S., Walnut Creek, Calif. She has been a reader and consultant for the College Board since 1995. She was a member of the test development committee and has been a table leader since 2001. She has conducted numerous workshops in the U.S. as well as in France and Canada. In 2002, she presented French AP Language and Literature in the First National AP Conference in Chicago and was certified as a National Consultant Leader for the College Board.

## LATIN: VERGIL

Jill Crooker taught Latin, all levels including AP Vergil and AP Latin Literature, for more than 25 years at Pittsford Mendon High School, N.Y. She has served as Reader, Table Leader, and presently Question Leader for samples for more than 10 years. She has conducted numerous AP summer institute sessions and has led professional development workshops in Maine and New York, as well as at The American Classical League Institutes for many years. She presently serves as the College Board Advisor on the AP Latin Test Development Committee and has responsibility for the professional development needs of teachers.



## MATHEMATICS PRE-AP VERTICAL TEAMING

Joyce Janiga has taught mathematics and mathematics education for nearly 30 years at the elementary, middle, high school and college level, as well as serving as district mathematics coordinator for a large urban school district in Arizona. She has been a consultant to the College Board in Pre-AP Mathematics as well as past member and Chair of the Academic Committee of the College Board's Western Region. She has given numerous workshops and institutes throughout the U.S. and Canada, and she has worked with school districts to improve mathematics programs and student performance. Joyce has been honored as Employee of the Year and also Woman of the Year at Paradise Valley Community College where she spent 16 years on faculty and as Division Chair. She has also been chosen to participate in summer research seminars in mathematics history at American University and fractal institutes at Fermi Lab and Princeton.



## PHYSICS B

Jiang Yu is a physics professor at Fitchburg State College in Massachusetts. She has been a physics exam reader for the AP program since 2000, and currently serves as the chief reader designate for the AP Physics reading. Jiang is a College Board certified workshop consultant and has led many AP Physics workshops and institutes. She is also a certified AP Physics syllabi auditor.



## SPANISH LANGUAGE

Milagros Juan-Ojermark is now serving as an Exam Leader at the AP Spanish readings and has served in the past as a Reader, Table Leader and Question Leader. She has taught numerous College Board Workshops and Summer Institutes, and as a National Leader Consultant she is involved in consultant training and cognitive observations for the College Board. Milagros has chaired various academic and professional committees, conducted workshops, presented at conferences, weeklong workshops, and is a Chief Reader for the Spanish PRAXIS exam. She has been part of the College Board Steering Committee for the Advanced Placement Conferences and chaired the CB Western Regional Academic Committee.

## STATISTICS

Brendan Murphy, John Bapst High School, Bangor, Maine, is a College Board national trainer and consultant for AP Statistics. He is a State of Maine Mentor for AP Statistics and is currently running a mentoring program for the Maine Department of Education.



## U.S. GOVERNMENT & POLITICS

Dr. Paul Weizer, of Fitchburg State College, Massachusetts, has been actively involved with the AP Government and Politics program for many years. He has been an AP reader for seven years, and he has conducted AP workshops and summer institutes since 1998.

## U.S. HISTORY

Jim Glinski has 30 years experience as a teacher and department chair at Xaverian Brothers High School in Westwood, Mass. He has served as a Reader and Table Leader at the AP U.S. History Exam Reading; been a consultant for workshops in AP U.S. History and AP European History; and received the College Board's New England region's Advanced Placement Recognition Award for Excellence in Teaching.
