Health Administration Resources

Specific online research tools related to health administration, leadership, long-term care, gerontology, and aging services include the following databases:

- [Academic Search Complete](#) is a multi-disciplinary full text database containing full text for more than 8,200 journals, including more than 7,100 peer-reviewed titles.
- [Business Source Complete](#) is the industry's most used business research database, providing full text for more than 3,600 journals, including full text for more than 1,800 peer-reviewed titles.
- [Health Source: Nursing/Academic Edition](#) provides nearly 550 scholarly full text journals focusing on many medical disciplines.
- [LexisNexis Academic](#) provides access to a wide range of news, business, legal, medical, and reference information from over 10,000 sources; most are available in full text. The service covers newspapers, magazines, broadcast transcripts, wire services, federal and state court opinions, federal and state statutes, federal regulations, and SEC filings. News information is updated daily and wire services several times daily.
- [Medline](#) provides indexing of over 4,800 bio-medical journals for authoritative information on medicine, nursing, dentistry, veterinary medicine, the health care system, pre-clinical sciences, and much more.
- [CINAHL Plus with Full Text](#) is the world's most comprehensive nursing & allied health research database, providing full text for more than 770 journals and indexing over 4,500 journals.
- [NHS Economic Evaluation Database](#) and [Health Technology Assessments](#) provide health administrators with resources aimed at lowering the cost and promoting the efficacy of care with information on costs and effects of drugs, treatments and procedures, and details on ongoing health technology assessment studies.

**Journals** - Journals related to Health Administration found in these databases include *American Journal of Public Health*, *Frontiers of Health Services Management*, *Harvard Business Review*, *Health Affairs*, *Health Care Financing Review*, *Healthcare Financial Management*, *Health Management Technology*, *Hospitals & Health Networks*, *Journal of Health Care Marketing*, and *Journal of Health Care Law & Policy*.

**Ebooks** - The library provides the following electronic books in our [Gale Virtual Reference](#) collection, which can be accessed through the Minerva catalog. On the library's website, under the "Catalog" tab, click the Minerva" link. Using the drop-down menu under "Select Library," choose "St. Joseph's College" from the alphabetical listing of libraries. Search for any of these resources using a title search. From the item's record, click on the "Restricted access (SJC)" link and enter your SJC login in order to search the title's content.
