

Notes and Bookmarks in Ebooks from the EBSCO Collections

Notes and bookmarks added to Ebooks that have been downloaded to a desktop computer and read using Adobe Digital Editions or via mobile app will not be retained when the Ebook's checkout expires.

To avoid this issue, do not download the Ebook. Instead, log into your EBSCO account, locate a book of interest, and click on the "Ebook Full Text" link.

Page through the book by using the navigation bar at the bottom of the screen or move quickly to content using the Table of Contents.
